Enrolment Interviews

As part of our enrolment process, all new families will be invited to attend an enrolment interview with our Assistant Principal for Kindergarten.

Every child, every opportunity

With its philosophy of "Every child, every opportunity" Ashfield Public School provides a differentiated curriculum to engage all students including gifted and talented students and students with learning needs. This includes smaller classes scheduled throughout the week for students to receive extension and enrichment or support in key learning areas.



Class parent

Every class at Ashfield Public School has a class parent. Throughout the year the class parent sends out regular WhatsApp messages to update parents about particular initiatives or events happening in the class or at the school.

If not choosing to opt out, contact numbers will be given to the class parent to organise whole class communication.

Technology

Ashfield Public School uses digital technologies to support student learning.

Students are taught how to effectively use technology to guide learning. This includes, for example, Ashfield Public School's emphasis on developing critical thinking, being able to write for sustained and appropriate periods of time, public speaking, physical activity and being able to concentrate whilst learning.

The school has a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) initiative. This initiative enables students to access technology at any time throughout the school day, anywhere in the school.

Students who do not have access to a personal device are able to share the school's devices. All children have access to the PCs in the library and throughout the school. All students have access to printing facilities.



Transition from preschool to Kindergarten

Starting school is a major life transition for children and their families. Ashfield Public School is focused on making this time of change a successful process that builds self-esteem and confidence in each child and connects parents with the school community.

In Term 4, Ashfield Public School offers a transition program for preschool children and their families.

The transition program enables children and families to become familiar with school routines, procedures, facilities, teachers, and special programs. The program enables children to feel comfortable, relaxed and motivated to join school in the new year. It provides a sense of belonging to their new school community.

During the transition week, children attend school from 9am to 10:30am each day.



Year Six buddies

At Ashfield Public School, Year 6 students maintain a prominent role in the playground as Playground Buddies.

Wearing their prominent yellow vests, the playground buddies will play with the younger children, cheer them up or find them a friend to play with. The playground buddies also take younger children and wait while they get a drink or go to the toilet.

Playground buddies are in the playground to make it an even friendlier place to spend recess or lunch.



Home reading and homework

At Ashfield Public School, the School Home Reading Program consists of the student's borrowing books from school for independent reading, or reading them aloud to a parent. Books read are recorded a reading log. After each 50 nights of home reading, students are awarded a certificate.

Ashfield Public School encourages families to complete homework with their children. This includes activities that reinforce the literacy and numeracy learning occurring in the classroom.



Extra-Curricular Activities

Ashfield Public School has a range of extra-curricular activities, offered privately by paid tutors or taught by the teachers.

Extra-curricular activities include:

- o Junior Choir, for all interested children from Kindergarten to Year 2.
- o Junior Recorder
- o Private piano lessons taught by Inner West Music College
- o Chess Club taught by the Sydney Academy of Chess.



Getting to know other parents

Ashfield Public School has a friendly and inclusive parent community. There are many opportunities to be involved at a social level with other parents.

Parents and friends are welcome to volunteer in many ways to assist Ashfield Public School deliver a quality education. The Parents and Citizens Association (P&C) holds regular meetings and invites parents to run committees or be part of the P&C.

Parents are invited to apply to Service NSW for a *Working With Children Check* and spend time in the classroom assisting the classroom teacher with literacy and numeracy groups or other learning projects.

There is also the option to be part of the numerous initiatives to raise money for the school.





Before and after school care

Action Plans

Many children have medical conditions such as asthma or eczema that need to be managed by the staff here at school. Management includes making special provisions or administering medication.

If a child has an ongoing medical condition that needs to be managed by the staff it is essential that parents go to your local doctor for an individual health care plan. This plan needs to be given to the school.

Permission to photograph

It is a NSW Department of Education requirement that parental permission is given for photographs and videos of your child to be created. Photographs and videos are used to engage students and meet curriculum outcomes. Photographs can be published in the school newsletter and on the school website. They may also be used to promote the school or promote public education.



Awards

The Student Awards system recognises and celebrates our student's capacity to make choices that support their ongoing progress.

The choices include to be responsible, respectful, resilient, fabulous, a friend, safe, a learner, healthy, inclusive, and embrace diversity. All students in the school are supported to earn a Certificate of Success for making positive choices.

Once a student has earned 10 Certificates of Success they receive a School Award at morning lines. After earning 5 School Awards they are presented with a School Medal. 5 school medals will earn the student a trophy and 5 trophies earn a school badge. All these achievements are recognised in the school newsletter, the Wangal News.



Occasional foods and birthdays

Occasional food for birthdays is to be purchased through the school canteen. No food from home is to be shared.

Parents are requested to inform the school if their child or children are not permitted to eat occasional foods or participate in birthday celebrations.



Sun safety

Ashfield Public School is sun smart. All children are required to wear a hat whenever they are outside.

Canteen

Our canteen 'Badalya', an Australian First Nation word for food, operates daily.




Preparing for school

- Label all items, including lunchbox, drink bottle, school bag and jacket, with your child's name. Check regularly as labels fade or fall off.
- o Help your child identify and recognise their personal belongings.
- o School bags need to be sturdy and large enough to accommodate a lunch box and library books.
- o Pack your child's lunch box in such a way that they can identify which food is for recess, lunch and Crunch 'n Sip.
- o Teach your child how to unwrap their food (including the plastic wrap), push a straw into a drink and repack food with no leakages.
- o Teach your child to recognise and write their name, remembering to use a capital letter for the first letter, with other letters written in lower case.
- Keep an extra pair of underpants and shorts in a plastic bag in your child's school bag. Toilet accidents sometimes happen.
- o Inform the school if you will be late for the daily 3pm pickup. A missing parent often causes much anxiety.
- o Give your child time to unwind and relax at the end of the day.
- o If your child is sick, it is highly beneficial to keep them at home. This supports a speedy recovery and reduces the risk that germs spread across the class.


This is what I need in my bag
